Speed of Play Policy

In an effort to make your play at Forest Akers more enjoyable, we have a speed of play policy for both the East and the West Courses. Our policy is that a group should finish 18 holes in under 4 hours and 30 minutes and finish 9 holes in under 2 hours and 15 minutes. This policy is to encourage slower groups to get around the course more quickly and eliminate some of the wait time for the faster groups. Our golf course assistants will continue to be available to assist groups with their speed of play.

Equitable Stroke Control

Equitable Stroke Control (ESC) keeps an exceptionally bad hole from changing your Handicap Index too much and sets a maximum number that a player can post on any hole, depending on the player's Course Handicap. For handicap purposes, after the round you are required to adjust your hole scores (actual or probable) when they are higher than the maximum ESC number you can post. All scores, including tournament scores, are adjusted for ESC. There is no limit to the number of holes on which you can adjust your score for ESC.

Course Handicap	Maximum Number on any Hole
9 or less	Double Bogey
10 through 19	7
20 through 29	8
30 through 39	9
40 or more	10

Post Your Scores...

- From home and away courses.
- In all forms of play: match play, stroke play, even team competitions in which you are requested to pick up.
- When you play at least 13 out of 18 holes or at least 7 out of 9 holes. On the holes you didn't play, record par plus any handicap strokes you would have received.
- If you play two nines (even if it's the same nine) or nines from different days. Simply combine the nines into an 18-hole score. Add each nine-hole Course Rating together and average the Slope Ratings.
- Played in an area observing an active season even when your home club is in an inactive season.

- Ten-day advanced tee-time reservations.
- 20% discount on merchandise (excluding golf equipment and sale items) in both golf shops.
- 10% discount on group instruction and clinics.
- 10% discount on cart and pull cart rentals.
- Complimentary handicap computation service.
- Reduced guest fees: guests playing with U-Club Golf Members are charged at the Forest Akers 18-hole coupon rate when riding and at the faculty/staff rate when walking or playing 9 holes.
- Merchandise and group instruction discounts are available to the entire family.
- The privilege of playing in the evenings after the last scheduled tee time (no guests allowed; carts not available).
- Saturday morning tee times (individual).



In addition, the Golf Committee provides you with:

- A seasonal electronic newsletter, exclusively for Golf Members, highlighting upcoming events and useful information about Forest Akers and the game of golf.
- An annual *Handbook & Directory of Members*, including schedules, information, and a member roster to help you get in touch with your fellow Golf Members.
- A variety of activities, including leagues, tournaments, social events, and special activities.
- An annual Season Kick-Off Reception, providing useful information, activity sign-ups, networking, and fun!
- A closing Season Awards Brunch, held in conjunction with the Club Championship, honoring our golfers and their accomplishments for the season.

How to Use Your Privileges

Any abuse of the Golf, Practice Center, or Short Game Facility guidelines outlined below may result in the revocation of your privileges at Forest Akers.

U-Club Golf Membership Card

Current members will use their existing cards. New members can pick up their card at the Forest Akers West golf shop.

1. Your U-Club Golf Membership ID Card is a scannable card that is coded with your membership number. ***It is for your use only.***
2. Your ID card is required for both golf and the Short Game Facility. Please show your card every time you check in to either golf shop.
3. Your ID card is also used to dispense range balls from the range machine. Those who forget their card will have to pay the cost of range balls.
4. Lost ID cards will be subject to a \$25 replacement fee.

Reservations

1. U-Club Golf Members may make tee-time reservations up to 10 days in advance by calling 355-1635 and identifying yourself as a U-Club Golf Member. Reservations may also be made online via the Forest Akers website at www.golf.msu.edu
2. Reservations may be made outside of the 10-day window for an advanced reservation fee of \$15 per tee time. You must call the phone host to schedule.
3. Forest Akers reserves the right to charge current fees for any golf member who fails to show up for or cancel a reserved tee time.
4. Weekend rates are in effect Friday through Sunday.

Golf Check-In Procedures

1. Whether playing in a league or on your own, you must check in and get a receipt at the East or West golf shop.
2. You will be required to present your ID card.
3. You must be playing in your group in order for your guests to receive the coupon or faculty/staff rate.

All Weather Practice Center

1. Your ID card must be used to dispense range balls.
2. Range balls are intended for ***your use only*** – not for the use of your guests.
3. You are expected to adhere to all Practice Center rules.

Short Game Facility

1. All members must check in at the East or West Golf Shop and show a member ID card.
2. The hours of operation for the Short Game Facility are the same as those for the Practice Center (see p. 13).
3. Shag bags with golf balls will be provided to you at the time of check-in. Shag bags issued by Forest Akers are required in order to control usage.
4. A maximum of ten golfers may use the Short Game Facility at any one time, determined on a first-come, first-served basis.
5. Based on availability, carts may be used to access the Short Game Facility.
6. The maximum shot distance for the Short Game Facility is 60 yards. The outer edge of the cut fairways indicates the 60-yard mark.
7. All golf balls must be picked up and ball marks must be repaired (see p. 16).
8. The MSU golf teams and instructional classes reserve the right to close the Short Game Facility.
9. All bunkers must be raked after use.

Kidz Club Child Care Center

Child Care is available to all U-Club members and their guests while on the premises, whether playing a round of golf, dining, swimming, or enjoying a massage. Located within the Fitness Center, the child care room is a bright, cheerful, cozy space staffed by competent professionals.



We welcome children ages newborn to 12 years old. To allow us to staff for quality, attentive care for your children, advance reservations (353-5113) are required for children under 24 months and recommended for all.

1. As a U-Club Golf Member, you have the opportunity to participate in numerous tournaments, leagues, and special events throughout the year.
2. Information on these events can be found in the binder by the West Golf Shop computer, in the U-Club member newsletter, and in the special electronic newsletter developed by the Golf Committee and distributed exclusively to golf members.
3. All registrations for scheduled events can be done using the binder by the West Golf Shop handicap computer, by e-mail to golfmsu@msu.edu, or by contacting the phone host at 355-1635.

Handicaps

1. All University Club handicaps will be computed by the in-house handicap software system.
2. Each Golf Shop has a dedicated computer for handicapping purposes.
3. When posting Forest Akers scores, enter your U-Club ID number (found on your Forest Akers ID card) then, simply follow the instructions from the computer.
4. When posting scores from other golf courses, you will need to post your score, the course rating, and the slope rating.
5. Handicaps are updated instantly.
6. Handicap cards can be picked up every two weeks in the West Golf Shop.

Forest Akers Golf Courses

Rules and Regulations of Play

1. Non-metal spikes are required on **BOTH** Forest Akers East and West.
2. United States Golf Association (USGA) Rules of Golf and posted local rules will govern play at all times.
3. All players must be registered with the starter before playing any part of the golf course.
4. Practicing anywhere on the golf course at any time is prohibited. Players must use the designated areas for practice.
5. Golfers must tee off between the designated tee markers.
6. Holes must be played in sequence, and a golfer in the wrong fairway must give way to the players playing the proper hole.
7. No more than one golfer shall play out of one bag. Each player must have his/her own set of clubs.
8. It is the responsibility of each golfer to replace divots, rake and smooth traps, and repair ball markers or other damage on the greens.
9. In the interest of all, players must play without delay and within the posted speed of play policy. All groups must keep their place on the course or allow following players to play through.
10. No play is permitted on a golf course that has been closed for any reason by the course manager.
11. All players must have a current receipt in their possession during play.
12. No more than four players may play together in the same group.
13. Golfers may be refused privileges or they may be removed from the golf course by the manager for the following:
 - a) Inability to maintain the course speed of play policy or maintain position on the course.
 - b) Intoxication, disorderly conduct, use of abusive language, or other behavior detrimental to the normal orderly operation of the golf course.
14. Forest Akers reserves the right to pair any groups with less than four players.

Golf Course Etiquette

In the interest of all Forest Akers golfers, adherence to certain rules of etiquette is essential in order to protect and preserve the maintenance quality of the golf courses. All golfers are asked to make play more pleasant for other patrons by willingly honoring the following etiquette:

1. The golfer will replace all fairway, tee, and rough divots. Roots will be placed down and then lightly pressed down with the foot so the grass can grow again and prevent a bad lie for the following golfer.
2. Ball marks on the green will be repaired by players with a golf tee or an accepted hand device (see below).

PLEASE REPAIR BALL MARKS! Only YOU can prevent ball mark damage!

RIGHT!

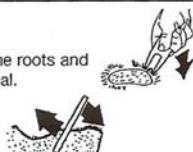
- 1) Close the gap/hole with putter by patting down the ball mark.
- 2) Insert *Green-Save* tool on the high side behind ball mark and push the back toward the center.
- 3) Do not pull up, twist or lift with the tool.
- 4) Push both sides of the ball mark into the center.
- 5) Gently tap the surface down with putter.
- 6) Never use loosened turf for repair.



WRONG!

Pulling up or lifting on the center or the sides will tear the roots and result in brown spots taking weeks for the surface to heal.

Do not pull up or twist with tool. This will only bring sand to the surface and tear the root system



RIGHT!

Insert tool and push back and sides forward to center. No damage to root system. Healing starts immediately.

3. Players will mark a ball on the green with a coin or other accepted golf marker, but will not scratch or dig into the green. Golfers should walk carefully on the green to prevent scuffing the turf on the green with their spikes. Pick up feet while walking, step lively, and do not drag spikes.

4. Extreme care should be exercised when removing or replacing the flag stick so as not to damage the turf around the lip of the cup. The flag stick should be laid carefully and gently next to the green during the putting period. Players will not use the flagstick as a rest or punch it into the green.
5. Only a putter will be used to putt on the green. Golfers will not intentionally drop or toss a putter on the green or lean on their putters on the putting surface.
6. Players will not drop their bags on the putting surface or apron of the green. Golfers will not carry their bag across a green – they should walk around the green.
7. Golfers will not lay or toss lit or unlit cigarettes, cigar butts, or matches on the greens or aprons.
8. Players should not step within 12" of the cup at any time after putting. Footprints on the green within this area will cause a putt to roll off line and will cause severe injury to the turf and compaction.
9. Practice on the tees, fairways, and greens is prohibited at any time. Practice pitch shots to the practice putting green are not permitted.
10. Players should walk around, not through, sand bunkers unless their ball is to be played out. Golfers should enter the sand bunker at a point closest to their ball and/or where the sand bunker is the lowest, making sure to leave the sand bunker with the least disturbance to the turf and sand.
11. Pull carts and power carts should stay at least 30 feet from the edge of the greens and off all teeing surfaces.
12. Golfers should help keep the golf course free of debris. No person shall throw, discard, place, or dispose of any garbage, refuse, cans, etc., on the golf course in any place other than a receptacle maintained for that purpose. Players should leave the golf course in better playing condition than they found it.

Power Cart Etiquette

1. When playing in the same group, golfers are not allowed to each have their own individual cart and drive separately, they must be paired together.
2. When playing in the Monday Golf League, golfers that do not rent golf carts, are not to drive a cart to their tee location and leave it on the golf course while playing.
3. Prior to starting, check to see if the power golf cart is set to go forward or backward and make the required adjustment if necessary.
4. Start the golf carts only after all have completed their drive from the tee. Do not drive out ahead of the ball that is closest to the tee. Never keep driving when a golfer in your group is playing a shot.
5. Stop even with the ball and on the side that you or your fellow rider's clubs are carried, depending who is playing the shot. The driver should park the golf cart reasonably close to the ball to be played so the golfer can study the shot, make his/her club selection, or change clubs without undue delay of game.
6. Take two or three golf clubs if the distance to the green is not easily discerned when the golf cart must be parked a distance from your ball. This avoids return trips to the cart and speeds play.
7. Park the golf cart in the rough when searching for a lost ball so as not to interfere with following golfers who may be asked to play through.
8. Never park in front of a green while putting. Park on the cart path or on the high side (30' minimum away) of the green nearest to the next tee. This speeds play and does not interfere with the following group.
9. Be certain that the driver sets the brake prior to leaving the golf cart. Do not drag feet outside the cart; keep them inside until the golf cart is stopped. No one is to enter or leave the golf cart while it is in motion.
10. Do not drive parallel to the top of a hill or rise to encourage a slanted position of the golf cart and cause it to overturn. Never make a sharp turn, even on a straightaway.
11. If two players in a foursome rent golf carts, they must pair up and ride together in one cart unless they have paid the full cart price to ride alone.



Tips for Speeding Up Play

Your Golf Committee has been receiving numerous complaints regarding speed of play during events. As a result, speed will be monitored closely during all league and special event play dates.

1. The speed of play policy for Forest Akers is 2:15 hours for nine holes and 4:30 hours for eighteen holes.
2. Have a plan for how you want to play the course.
3. Pay close attention to the pace of play clocks every three holes and adjust your speed of play accordingly.
4. Carry a spare ball or two.
5. Take no mulligan or practice shots.
6. Decide what club you will need to use before you get to the ball.
7. Think about your next shot, where to place your bag or pull cart or where to park your golf cart.
8. Be prepared to play when it is your turn. Select your club, line up your shot or study your putt. Make your practice swings while others are playing. When it is your turn, address the ball and hit it.
9. Do not stop with playing partners while they hit their ball. Go to your own ball if you are not in danger of getting hit.
10. Watch where you hit your own ball, so it can be found quickly. If in doubt, hit a provisional.
11. Be realistic when waiting to hit to a green or off the tee.
12. Learn how far you can hit the ball with each club.
13. Watch the actions of other putts to learn about speed and break on the greens.
14. Play the ball as it lies at all times. No winter rules apply unless turf conditions so warrant.
15. Repair ball marks and divots while waiting for other players, not when it is your turn.
16. Mark your scores as you walk to the next tee, not on the green you just played.
17. Be conscious of the lost ball rule in looking for a lost ball. Only the player affected should spend time looking while the others hit.
18. Forget honors. The first person off the green and on the tee should hit it.
19. Shorter distance players hit first as soon as the group ahead is out of range.

20. If a group behind is pressing you, wave them through, then speed up your own play.
21. If two are riding, the player first to hit should make his/her club selection, then take two more clubs, one longer and one shorter. While the first player is preparing to hit, the other player should ride to his/her ball. Do not wait for each other.
22. At the green, the driver should bring the other player's putter, if he/she doesn't already have it (which they should).
23. When driving from hole to hole, notice the flag stick placement on other greens that you will be playing later on.
24. Rake or smooth out divots in sand traps that you land in.
25. Read directional signs and other notices that will help you with club selection, where to go next, etc.
